Chapter 465 Minutes – February 11

Meeting Called to Order - 7:00 PM by President Ralph Richards

Attendance – 19 members and two guests attended

Chapter Elections – President Richards discussed the organizing of the election Committee to present candidates for the 2015/2016 President. According to the Bylaws the President is elected one year, and the Treasurer/Membership officer the alternate year, to help maintain continuity of management of the Chapter . Mac Gleim stated that David Fretwell was the committee’s nomination for president. Mr. Fretwell agreed to serve, a motion and a second were made to install Mr. Fretwell as president and a unanimous vote of the members confirmed his election. He then took over chairperson of the meeting.

Minutes - Minutes of the December and January meetings were approve as submitted.

Treasures Report – Bank Balance as of January 30, 2015 is \$1,242.06 was reported by Dale Ramey the Chapter Treasurer.

Membership Report – Dale Ramey, Chapter Membership officer presented a summary of paid, and pending members. Reminder notices will be sent to all unpaid members. It was noted that EAA will provide a free 6 month membership to a guest if they provide the needed information to the Chapter or enter it into the EAA website. It was also agreed that Chapter 465 would provide a

similar 6 month free membership to guests who apply for the EAA guest membership.

Old Business

- **Cooperation between the Estrella Warbirds Museum and EAA** was discussed. Steve Stelzle attended and represented The Estrella Warbirds Museum. Two specific areas of future cooperation relate to the Aug. 29 Warbirds Event. First the Museum is looking for volunteers to assist during the event. Second, it was agreed that EAA would organize a static display of aircraft including an EAA Booth. The Key contact at Estrella is Scott Stelzle, airshow coordinator, 805-610-3310, sasentinc@netzero.com. Two EAA members volunteered to coordinate this activity with Scott. Phil Corman who will be developing display materials for this and all EAA events (see following).
- **Cooperation between PRAA and EAA**, Phil Corman provided an overview of PRAA, and suggested that two areas of immediate cooperation could include EAA members. First, providing assistance to PRAA/City led events (i.e. see Airport Appreciation Day following). Second participating in PRAA organized fly-outs which occur every second Saturday leaving the Airport at 8:00 AM. The next fly out is to Porterville on Saturday 14th Feb. Tony Gaspar is the contact person at PRAA, see the PRAA web site for details www.prb-association.com

New Business

- **2015 Events Schedule** –A copy of the first draft 2015 Chapter schedule of events was

provided. *This will be updated by the Chapter President as new events and guest speakers are identified*, and will be sent out with them monthly newsletter and placed on the Chapter Web Site www.eaa465.org. More detailed discussion of specific events follow.

- **Santa Margarita Ranch Antique Tractor Day May 23-24.** The Estrella Museum and EAA Chapter have been encouraged by the event manager to provide static displays of aircraft. *Dave Fretwell will coordinate this with Estrella and the Ranch. It is anticipated that an EAA booth will be set up if Phil Corman's Promotion and Funding Committee has it ready.* This event is not an open fly in because it is a private strip. All planes must be approved and have signed waivers before participating. It is anticipated that EAA will provide 3-5 aircraft with the majority being older planes. Several members offered to fly planes to the event.
- **Airport Appreciation Day, June 6th** – This event is led and coordinated by PRAA in cooperation with the Town and Airport Manager. The event is between 10:00 and 2:00. EAA members are encouraged to provide aircraft for static display. The EAA will organize young Eagles flights (see following).
- **Young Eagles Committee** – *Frances Bowman is the Chapter Young Eagles coordinator* Unfortunately she was unable to attend the meeting. She and her committee are requested to present their plan for the June 6 Airport Appreciation Day at the next EAA meeting in March.
- **For Tri-Motor Event** – Paul Kendrick, President of EAA Chapter 170, and David Fretwell, spoke about joining forces with the two Chapters to implement the event. EAA proposed the event

April 9 -12 at KPRB and KSBP (this was changed after the meeting to the April 16-20 because the previous dates are Easter). It was agreed that the two chapters would work together to organize the event with EAA. **Ralph Richards agreed, with the support of Darrel Radford and Dave Fretwell to coordinate activities at Paso, and they will work with Paul Kendrick at SLO.**

Mac Gleim is currently coordinating development of this activity with Mike Laubach, and Joel Marketello and it is hoped that that key decisions on the activity can be made at the March Chapter meeting. Dave Fretwell offered to continue to clarify the airframe ownership, legal issues relating to donors, possible registration of the Chapter as a non-profit 501 c 3, and sale of the completed project by the Chapter.

- **EAA Promotion and Funding Committee** – *Phil Corman, Chapter Publicity Coordinator, and his committee, will present a proposal by the next EAA meeting for development of a EAA display booth that can be used at all events where EAA is involved. The Web Page is to be updated.*
- **Aircraft Building Committee** - A discussion was held regarding type of plane to acquire (i.e. kit or vintage GA), methods of obtaining donated planes from donors, EAA and subsequent owner issues, and location for building program. A number of members expressed interest in participating in this project and several offering immediate interim funding. Bill Schaller has offered shop space on his property for building. Dave Fretwell briefed members on some of the legal issues related to donations, and ownership of planes, by EAA Chapters. If a donor wants a tax deduction the Chapter would have to register as a 501 c 3 (about one third of all chapters have already done this). While the Chapter can own a plane, it cannot fly it due to liability concerns, thus a built or restored plane would have to be sold. Dave Fretwell placed a “wanted” advertisement for a possible donation of a kit or vintage aircraft in the March issue of Sport Aviation.
- **Type Fly-ins.** In order to promote the airport, increases traffic and airport revenue, and support the local economy four type club fly-ins are being investigated. EAA and PRAA need to work with Airport Management and Town officials to provide support for these events.
 - a. Mooney. Phil Corman, who is the President of the Mooney club, and got the Club to hold its fly-in at Paso the weekend of June 12-14, and the Estrella Museum has agreed to provide related conference space.
 - b. Lancair: Dave Fretwell Contacted the Lancair Lobo Club, regarding an informal west coast fly-in. Lobo supports the idea, but given the fact that the National Fly-in is in Colorado in September, it would conflict with Paso Event. As such it was agreed to organize a west coast event in 2016
 - c. Cessna 170: Darrell Radford has not made contacts yet but will do so for discussion at the March meeting.
 - d. Short Wing Pipers – Dale Ramey is working on finding coordinates of the previously existing clubs and will bring more details for discussion to the March meeting.
- **Program** – ADS-B Phil Corman gave an informative presentation regarding FAA’s ADS-B rules. All aircraft flying above FL180 and into Class B & C

airspace will be required to have ADS-B Out equipment installed and certified prior to January 1, 2020. If a pilot avoids these areas, he does not fall under this FAA rule. Recent regulatory changes allow experimental aircraft to use non TSO equipment to meet the mandates as long as the equipment meets TSO standards and this is expected to greatly reduce the cost of installing the equipment in experimental aircraft. Phil has set of slides on the presentation with more details.

EXPERIENCE OF 1920s LUXURY AVIATION WITH EAA'S FORD TRI-MOTOR TOUR

Re-live the beginnings of airline travel with "The Tin Goose"

- EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wis. — (January 15, 2015) — The Experimental Aircraft Association's (EAA) immaculate 1929 Ford Tri-Motor will be touring the country offering an opportunity for passengers to experience flight aboard the world's first mass-produced airliner. During EAA's Ford Tri-Motor Tour, passengers will travel back to the early days of what was considered luxurious commercial air travel.
 - The Ford Tri-Motor or the "Tin Goose" was first built by the Ford Motor Company in the late 1920s. EAA's Ford Tri-Motor was constructed in 1929 and has an intriguing history, with roles ranging from service as Cuban airliner to extensive background fighting forest fires while transporting smoke jumpers.
 - After a thunderstorm wrecked havoc on the airplane in 1973, EAA Founder Paul Poberezny purchased the aircraft, which then underwent a 12-year restoration. Since then it has been hangared at the EAA Museum's historic Pioneer Airport and only departs to make public appearances and for its touring.
- EAA's Ford Tri-Motor has also made a celebrity appearance in two major movies—1960's "Family Jewels" starring Jerry Lewis and 2009's "Public Enemies" starring Johnny Depp.
 - EAA's Tri-Motor can carry up to nine passengers at a time, and every seat has a window. Passengers are encouraged to bring a camera to record and share this experience. Tickets purchased in advance are \$70 for adults; walk up tickets are \$75 and \$50 for children 17 years old and under.
 - The Ford Tri-Motor will continue its 2015 tour in the southwestern U.S. through April. Book your spot on the historic "Tin Goose" through a secure flight-reservation system at www.flytheford.org, EAA's Tri-Motor tour website. You can also pre-book a flight by calling 1-800-843-3612.
